**LA84 Foundation Awards \$5,000 Grant to Community Action Partnership of Orange County's El Modena Family Resource Center Karate Program for Low Income Youth**

**Orange, CA – January 9, 2018** – Community Action Partnership of Orange County (CAPOC) is proud to receive a grant from the LA84 Foundation for the amount of \$5,000. The grant will go towards the El Modena Family Resource Center (EMFRC) Karate Club Program. Funding from LA84 are legacy funds from the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics.

The EMFRC Karate Club Program enrolls over 50 students of all ages from neighborhoods surrounding the EMFRC in Orange with a focus on low-income, at risk youth. The Karate Club is a free-of-cost program that is offered year-round and meets three days a week. Two qualified instructors teach the students about physical fitness, self-discipline, respect, self-confidence, and of course, karate.
