**Gregory C. Scott Appointed to the Anaheim Workforce Development Board**

**Anaheim, CA – November 5, 2018** – The President & Chief Executive Officer of Community Action Partnership of Orange County (CAP OC), Gregory C. Scott, was recently appointed to the Anaheim Workforce Development Board, as approved by the Anaheim City Council in September 2018.

The Anaheim Workforce Development Board oversees funding, provides strategic planning, and develops policies that enhance workforce objectives. This is accomplished by facilitating a framework that puts public policy to work on workforce development issues. They promote partnerships among businesses, local agencies, educational institutions, and the community, coordinating resources and working together to strengthen our community, businesses, and workforce.

Mr. Scott has worked extensively in the private and non-profit sectors focusing on social justice, diversity, education, youth development, poverty, financial stability, food and hunger, affordable housing, homelessness, and veteran issues. Mr. Scott previously served as a member of the Board of Directors for the Orange County YMCA Community Services Branch, and is currently a board member for Holman Community Development Corporation, the Orange County Emergency Food and Shelter Program Board, the South Los Angeles Collaborative for Transitional Aged Youth, and the Southern California Counseling Center (SCCC).

Luz Flores, Executive Director of the Anaheim Workforce Development Board, after Mr. Scott's appointment, stated that "we are pleased to have Gregory C. Scott joins our Board and brings his prior workforce development knowledge and experience along with opportunities for increased involvement of Community Action Partnership of Orange County."
